**Minutes of previous AGM** were circulated in the newsletter for all members to read, and were accepted as read. Moved Ron King, seconded Darrell Johnson, agreed by all in attendance.

**Business Arising -**

Mary Toy - thanked Bernie Webb for including the 2003 financial report in the newsletter, the first one in three years. Also pleased to see that receipts were not being issued for subscriptions, not necessary. Financial reports for 2001 & 2002 still not printed in the newsletter as promised to members previously. Financial report is important and members should be aware of financial situation of the organisation.

Vern Westley (as Auditor of 2001/2 records) responded giving a brief outline of circumstances leading to the delay of the audit and assured members that the balance in the bank is correct to the best of his knowledge. Vern Westley gave a brief overview of the ADF (Anglican Deposit Fund) which was endorsed by Betty Solosy. Bendigo Bank had also been looked at. One of the features being looked at is internet access availability and local access for the Treasurer.

We have come to the end of another year which is the twenty seventh year of this Association of retired members of Customs and their friends. This Association is a unique group of people with those who retired from Customs being of the age or those who left for other careers outside. Eligible members

who join find their spouses and partners automatically receiving full membership. Others who wish to join may do so and are officially known as 'friends' who receive all benefits as members but do not have voting rights at our AGM's. As an Association without assets we can run on a cheap membership fee of \$6 (at present) or as a 'friend' we ask for a donation equivalent of the members' fee to cover the cost of mailing newsletters etc. Spouses or partners of original members remain eligible to stay as members when the original member passes on.


