Spread the Wealth

Tax cuts are a sure way to buy votes, but are they fair to all?

It's that time of year again when the federal government outlines its plans for our economic futures through the budget. Over recent years tax cuts have been used to buy our votes & they seem to be the federal government's preferred choice when it comes to spreading the wealth. But tax cuts always create controversy about whether they are fair. Often there are claims that tax cuts favour the rich rather than the poor.

A reader sent in this fascinating explanation to help us understand tax cuts. I like it -

Every day ten people go out for dinner. The total bill comes to \$100. They decide to pay their bill the way they pay their taxes. The first four (the poorest) paid nothing. The fifth paid \$1. The sixth paid \$3. The seventh paid \$7. The eighth paid \$12. The ninth paid \$18. The tenth person (the richest) paid \$59.

To reward their daily support the restaurant owner cut the cost of the meals by \$20 to \$80. The group still wanted to pay their bill the way we pay our taxes. The first four were unaffected, they would still eat for free. The remaining realised that \$20 divided by six is \$3.33. But if they subtracted that from everybody's share, then the fifth & sixth would each end up being paid to eat. The restaurateur suggested reducing each man's bill roughly by the same percentage. The fifth man, like the first four, now paid nothing (100% saving). The sixth paid \$2 instead of \$3 (33% saving). The seventh paid \$5 instead of \$7 (28% saving). The eighth paid \$9 instead of \$12 (25% saving). The ninth paid \$15 instead of \$18 (17% saving). The tenth paid \$49 instead of \$59 (16% saving). Each of the six was better off, and the first four continued to eat for free, but then the men began to compare their savings.

'I only got a dollar out of the \$20' the sixth said, pointing to the tenth, 'but you got \$10!' 'That's true!' the seventh shouted. 'Why should you get \$10 back when I only got \$2? The wealthy get all the breaks!' 'Wait a minute', the first four yelled in unison, 'we didn't get anything at all. The system exploits the poor!'

The next night the tenth person had had enough & didn't show up for dinner. When the bill came for the others they discovered they didn't have enough money between them for even half of it.

That is how our tax system works. Those who pay the highest taxes get the most benefit from a tax reduction. Tax them too much, attack them for being wealthy, & they may choose to dine in Monaco instead.

Footnote:

The poor Danes are the most taxed people in the world. The most taxed Danish citizens pay a whopping 68% of their hard earned kroner, & even at the low end, income tax begins at 42%.


