Holidays Abroad - Self-drive Europe

If you are contemplating a self-drive holiday in Europe, you may not be aware of the advantages offered by leasing a vehicle rather than hiring one. The French government allows the three major vehicle manufacturers (Citroen, Peugeot and Renault) to lease brand new vehicles to non-EEC residents without the companies having to pay GST on the sale of the vehicle at the end of the lease. Although there are slight differences between manufacturers, the basic features are:

- Minimum 17 days lease (Citroen and Peugeot), 21 days (Renault), maximum 6 months
- A brand new 'Tax Free' car registered in your name.
- Comprehensive vehicle insurance (including fire, theft and third party) with no excess payable.
- Free pick up and return at major cities in France. (Additional European locations available with surcharge.)
- No hidden extras, including unlimited kilometres and no extra charge for additional drivers.
- Minimum driver age of 18 (21 with Citroen) with a full driver's licence, no upper age limit.
- 24 Hour Roadside Assistance in most European countries - if they can't fix it within 24 hours they will give you another.

How much does it cost? For the first 17 days there's a fixed fee that depends on the model chosen, starting from about A\$1250. After that you go onto a daily rate that can be as low as A\$23 per day. So the longer you have it the cheaper the average overall rate becomes.

Which model? This really gets down to personal choice, but for parking in European cities, small is good, smaller is better! In 2004 we leased a Citroen C5 station wagon because we planned to meet up with our son and daughter and needed the extra luggage room. In 2006 we decided on a Citroen Xara Picasso for a couple of reasons - they gave us 3 free days hire because we were repeat Citroen customers and there was an additional 9 free days Early-bird concession for booking before 31 March. But most importantly for us, this small car had an incredible boot capacity that swallowed up two full-sized 76cm suitcases, plus two cabin bags, plus a laptop, plus a carton of beer. And still had room for the collapsible shopping trolley that comes as standard equipment! The Picasso also had some nice other features including under-floor storage bins and drop-down tables, airlines-style, in the back seats - invaluable when stopping for a cup of tea. The Picasso will again be our choice for this year's trip, it is very comfortable for two people.

Petrol or Diesel? If you plan to spend most of your time in UK it might be worth considering a petrol-fuelled engine since the hire costs are a little cheaper. But otherwise the answer will almost certainly be diesel. Diesel fuel is generally much cheaper than petrol, except in UK and a limited number of other places. Check current fuel prices and do your sums at -

Left-hand Drive: So, what's it like driving on the wrong side of the road? The first few hours can be a bit, well, interesting, especially as you approach your first roundabout. But most people adapt quite quickly and by the end of the second day you should be feeling quite comfortable. Nevertheless I'd like a dollar for every time I've turned on the windscreen wipers to signal a left turn.

Arrival in France: If you plan to pick up a car straight after flying into France, don't plan to drive very far on the first day until you get some rest. Emirates have a flight that leaves Perth at 06:00 and arrives in Paris CDG at 20:20 local time. This has the advantage that you arrive on the same day as you leave, ignoring the fact that because of time differences it becomes a 31 hour day.

Driving in Towns and Cities: European drivers are refreshingly courteous and that helps greatly. Even so, driving in central Paris is only for the very brave (or foolish!). We use a Tom-tom navigator to take us to the undercover parking station nearest to the tourist bureau in the town we are visiting. Why an undercover one? Because you pay on exit (many accept credit cards) and therefore don't have to worry about running back to feed a meter or worse, watching your car being towed away.


