On Sunday, 17 August 2008, Jacky Hubbard, her husband Paul, and their grandson Kieron (14), set out from Campbelltown for a four hour trip to Gloucester NSW to visit Lorraine Otieno at Narraweena Nursing Home. Here is Jacky's story.

It was a pleasant drive along the M7, through Parramatta before joining the Pacific Highway. It was certainly a different story on the return trip! After Newcastle we headed towards Taree, enjoying the NSW country landscape from Stroud to Gloucester. We arrived in Gloucester via Bucketts Way, which became Church Road and, heading towards the town centre, we found Gloucester Hospital situated on the right-hand side of the road, nice and easy, at least we did not have to go searching for the place. As it was lunchtime, we decided to drive into town for lunch at Café 57, which is on the main street, before going to visit Lorraine (if anyone visits Lorraine, please buy her a takeaway latte from here as she thoroughly enjoys the little treat).

As soon as we walked in to Lorraine's room, the first thing she said was "Hello Jacky, have you come for the meeting?" I said "What meeting?" and she said "Union Meeting". I said I had come to visit her and, as she tried to get out of her chair, she said she would make me a coffee. Only having use of her right side, she still tries to get up and about but cannot do so without the assistance of nursing staff, which, as you can imagine, is very hard for her as she has always been so extremely active.

We stayed for a good couple of hours and during that time had a good laugh and chat about various incidents that occurred in Customs which Lorraine remembered from years ago. She recalled a few current things like the birth of her

new little grandson Blake, whom she dotes on, and she also told me about some of the problems she has with movement and how the physiotherapist comes in regularly and gives her various exercises to do. She also offered some good advice to Kieron. After asking him how he was going at school she told him to "stay away from the girls as they are nothing but trouble, trust me I am a girl". Don't know whether he will heed the advice, we'll see.

Whilst Lorraine's speech is still slow at times, she is improving daily and I did not have any problems understanding her. I believe a lot of people are under the impression that she would not be able to talk to them if they phoned but that is far from true.

Lorraine said that it would be lovely to see her old work colleagues again however if you cannot visit a telephone call to her mobile would be great. If you ring and she doesn't answer, it is because she is away from the phone, probably at physiotherapy, and it would be best to call again as at this stage she is physically unable to return calls.

Lorry has not quite mastered sending a sms yet however a letter would be most welcome. This would also help her with her rehabilitation as she needs this type of therapy to stimulate the brain. She has no problem relating to the past but needs the stimulation to help her with the present. Her contact details are:

HMAS Sydney Customs Link

There is an investigation into the sinking of HMAS SYDNEY off WA in 1941. The Sydney carried at least two 'Carley' floats to be used as unsinkable lifeboats. A Carley float was picked up at sea by HMAS Heros about a week after the sinking of the Sydney. It is thought to have come from the Sydney and is in the Australian War Memorial in Canberra. In 1942, a second Carley float was washed up on Christmas Island with the body of a sailor in it. The body was buried on Christmas Is, while the float disappeared. The 'story' on the second float was that it was cut in two and sent to Fremantle where it was destroyed by Customs some years later. In talking to experts at the AWM and NAA there is no evidence at all for the story and they consider it a rumour that has been embellished over time. Given it was war time and over 60 years ago records could have been lost or not even made.


