Treasurer's Report - was circulated in the 'Duty Freed' for all members to read, and was accepted as read. No business arising from report. *Accepted by all in attendance.*


It is with regret we advise the passing of Peter Proud on Sunday December 28th 2008. His funeral was held on Monday January 5th at Karrakatta.


